 - Baptist history is the story of Christians seeking the old paths and the ancient landmarks for which great men of faith have suffered and died to hand down to us.
- Baptists have never been ٠
- became a serious threat to American churches.
- In 1909 A.C. Dixon and R. A. Torrey began publishing a 12-volume set of books titled The Fundamentals: A Testimony to the Truth.
 - They became known as the Five Points of Fundamentalism
 - The inerrancy of Scripture
 - The virgin birth of Christ
 - The substitutional atonement of Christ
 - The bodily resurrection and future second coming of Christ
 - The authenticity of the biblical miracles
- Anybody who was against Modernism and who believed these fundamentals of the faith made an effort to identify themselves as a "fundamentalist".

- The Northern Baptists had some prominent pastors who were supported by wealthy liberal donors, so they preached liberal doctrines.
 - One famous sermon in 1922 was "Shall the Fundamentalists Win?"
 - In the 1930s, many pastors pulled their churches out of the Northern Baptist Convention.
- It wasn't long until liberalism pushed its way into the Southern Baptist Convention as well.
 - In the 1940s, many Southern Baptist pastors chose to leave the convention instead of compromising their faith.
- Reasons for leaving the conventions:
 - The conventions collected churches' mission's money and used it to support missionaries who didn't believe the gospel or the fundamentals of the faith.
 - They corrupted the minds of students in their seminaries, as they taught liberalism.
 - They elected men to leadership positions within the conventions who did not believe the Bible and the gospel.
- The churches that left the Conventions didn't have a name other than Baptist Churches.
 - They were fundamental That's why they left the liberal Conventions.
 - They were independent They were on their own.
 - They were Baptist They still held to the Scriptural distinctives that Baptists had always believed.
 - They became known as Independent Fundamental Baptists.
- Independent Baptist churches have historically been soulwinning churches that work to reach communities with the gospel through bus ministries, addiction programs, prison ministries, and other soulwinning ministries.
- The original Baptist churches in America were completely independent, then they grouped themselves into associations, then they grew into conventions, then many who left the conventions became independent, but formed fellowships centered around missionaries or colleges. Eventually, many left fellowships to become completely independent like the original Baptist churches in America.
- We are Independent.
 - We are an autonomous, self-governing, New Testament church.
- We are Fundamental.
 - $\circ~$ We believe the core doctrines of the Bible literally.
- We are Baptist.
